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Our wider community in Ophthalmology

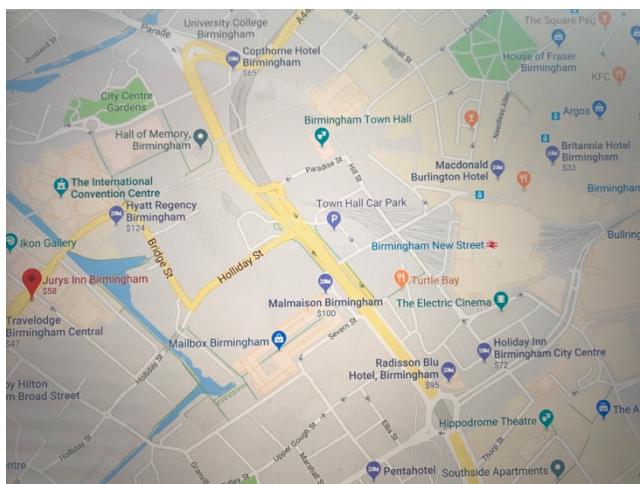
From around the Midlands our Ophthalmologists are making a global impact on the burden of sight loss. One country's needs will be different to another; how do we address this on a global platform?
